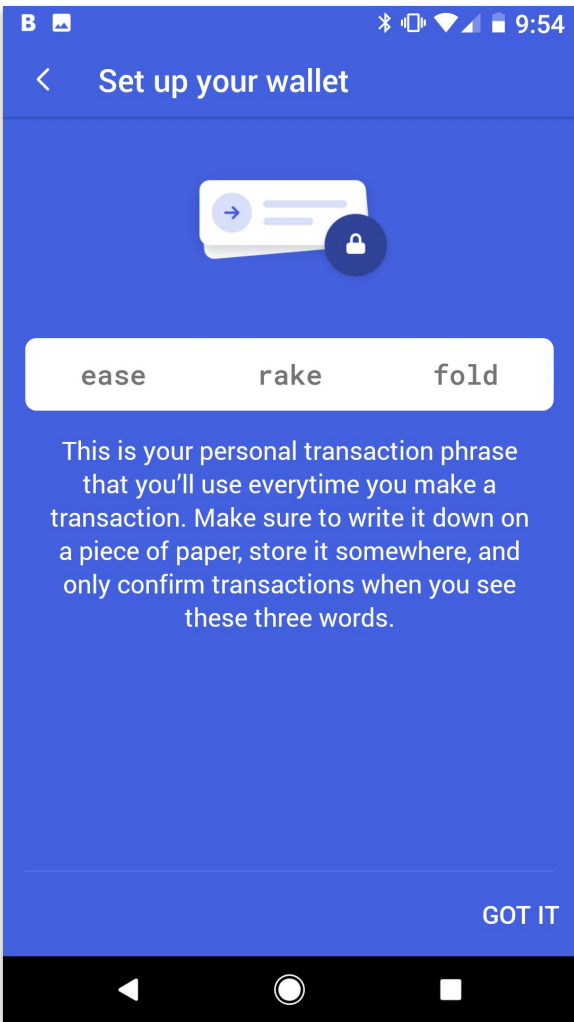


One of the challenges of writing for the Status UI was that the application's very broad set of use case. Being mobile-first meant having to get a lot of meaning into not much space.

The words here are carefully chosen to convey the scope of possibility, without overwhelming the user with details.

We used some jargon, considering what we knew about user mindset and the point in the user journey - i.e. having been acquired through marketing and/or come through the app store.



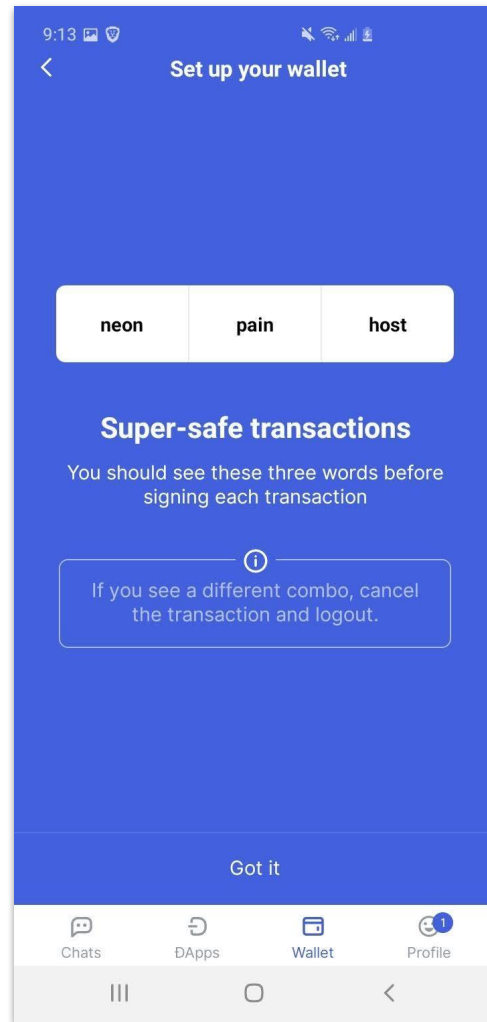

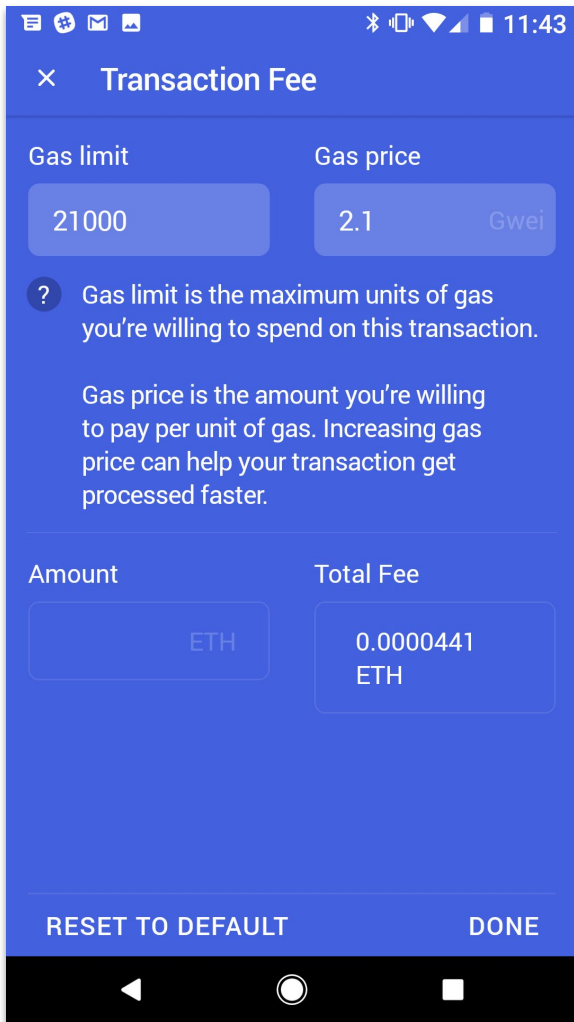


In the rewrite of this screen, I focused on making the text more scannable and using clear, direct language.

If I could create another iteration, I might try using the top-level, most visible text for the most pertinent information, or explicit guidance for the user. E.g., **Remember these words**

When dealing with new conceptions, such as “gas” on the Ethereum network, it’s important to use the UI to educate users. Still, the goal is to be more concise so that the user isn’t overwhelmed by the amount of text.

Unfortunately, the red text bubble seen in the “After” screen was not part of this rewrite. If I could rewrite that guidance, I’d be more plain: “Price must be > 0” for example.
